After the kind of year we've had, how do we imagine the future? It feels like a trap, after so many plans have had to change because of this pandemic. And yet, we trust that God goes ahead of us, preparing a future and inviting us into it.

The pandemic is not yet over, and we still have reason to be cautious about our health and the health of our neighbors. But as faithful people, we can ask: what will God's reign look like in this strange world we're living in? How can we do God's will right now?


We have never stopped worshipping God on Sundays, the day of resurrection. We plan to continue our ministry of live-streaming worship long after this virus recedes into the past—it's too valuable as a source of connection for those experiencing hospitalization or needing to stay at home. We can even share Holy Communion this way—where can God *not* go? The Holy Spirit connects us with the Body of Christ, wherever we are. We have welcomed new members and plan to welcome more new church members later this year!

We have never stopped serving our neighbors. We continue gathering food and household items for people living in poverty, working with our partners at Isaiah 58 and St. Anthony's. We still make prayer shawls for patients in hospice care, and we still host blood drives with the Red Cross (in fact, we'll have a blood drive here on July 19!). Some of us have gotten creative in sharing artwork and cards with one another as well (I've sure been grateful for the cards people have sent to welcome me over the past few months!).

And we have never stopped learning. Our group studies for adults have moved online via Zoom. Children's sermons were shared by video for many months and now have returned to the Sunday worship service. We have an outdoor Vacation Bible School scheduled for Wednesday evening, July 14<sup>th</sup> and Saturday morning, July 17<sup>th</sup>—meeting at nearby Tilles Park—for kids as young as infants and up through elementary age, with other adults and high school-age youth helping out as leaders!

Even if some of our practices look different right now, we're doing the same ancient things that our ancestors have been doing for thousands of years. And God continues to form us as the Body of Christ in the world. Let us pray and seek God's vision for the future as well!

# **Synod Assembly Notes**



On June 4 and 5, the Central States Synod of the ELCA, which consists of churches in the states of Kansas and Missouri, held its annual assembly. The general theme this year was "United with Christ in Baptism: One Body-Many Members." Gethsemane's delegates-Pastor Cheryl, Eliza Sanders, and Steve Hetager-were three of 300 delegates meeting by Zoom from far-flung places all over the two states.

Synod bishop Susan Candea presided over the entire assembly, including the full worship service that began the assembly on Friday evening. "Great faith expands to include all" was the theme of her sermon. Our former pastor, Kendra Nolde, was a member of the planning team for this service.

The keynote address for the assembly was then delivered by Judith Roberts, ELCA Senior Director for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. Among the topics she discussed was the concept of race as a social construct; that is, in reality all human beings ultimately come from Africa and share a common genetic heritage.

The Saturday morning session began with a musical presentation by students from Lutheran Campus Ministry at Kansas State University. Their presentation included encouraging delegates to participate in physical exercises and yoga in preparation for the day's events, which included a long series of business items to be considered and voted on.

These items included nominations for synod offices, constitutional amendments, resolutions, compensation guidelines, and the synod budget. The resolutions, all of which passed, involved issues of conscience, global awareness, embracing the earth, child protection, racial justice, and thanksgiving for ministry,

The morning session also included a presentation by Pastor Kendra on Faithful Innovation Teams in congregations, a program that she has been involved in. It was interesting to note other familiar names among the delegates, including Pastor Carrie McElfresh (who has presided at Gethsemane), Pastor Jeff Lindgren, and former Gethsemane member Linda Lockhart.

The afternoon session included a presentation on Lutheran Disaster Relief, election results, and a short Sending Worship ceremony. Bishop Candea pronounced the assembly a success in spite of the difficulties involved in the virtual format, and she said that she expected next year's assembly to be an in-person event.

# God's work. Our hands. Save the Date: Sunday, August 29, 2021





# **Caring for Creation through Song**

Did you know that the ELCA has a statement on Caring for Creation, and our biblically rooted role in doing so?

"Christian concern for the environment is shaped by the Word of God spoken in creation... We of the ELCA are deeply concerned about the environment, locally and globally, as members of this church and as members of society. Even as we join the political, economic, and scientific discussion, we know care for the earth to be a profoundly spiritual matter. As Lutheran Christians, we confess that both our witness to God's goodness in creation and our acceptance of caregiving responsibility have often been weak and uncertain".

#### The statement:

"offers a vision of God's intention for creation and for humanity as creation's caregivers; acknowledges humanity's separation from God and from the rest of creation as the central cause of the environmental crisis; recognizes the severity of the crisis; and expresses hope and heeds the call to justice and commitment."

This summer, our Hymn of the Day and Post Communion Canticle will often focus on Creation, and our care of creation. We do this to bring our Sunday actions (worship through song) into our daily actions (caring for creation). We build our repertoire as a singing congregation and become witnesses through our voices to care for our world so in need of our love.


